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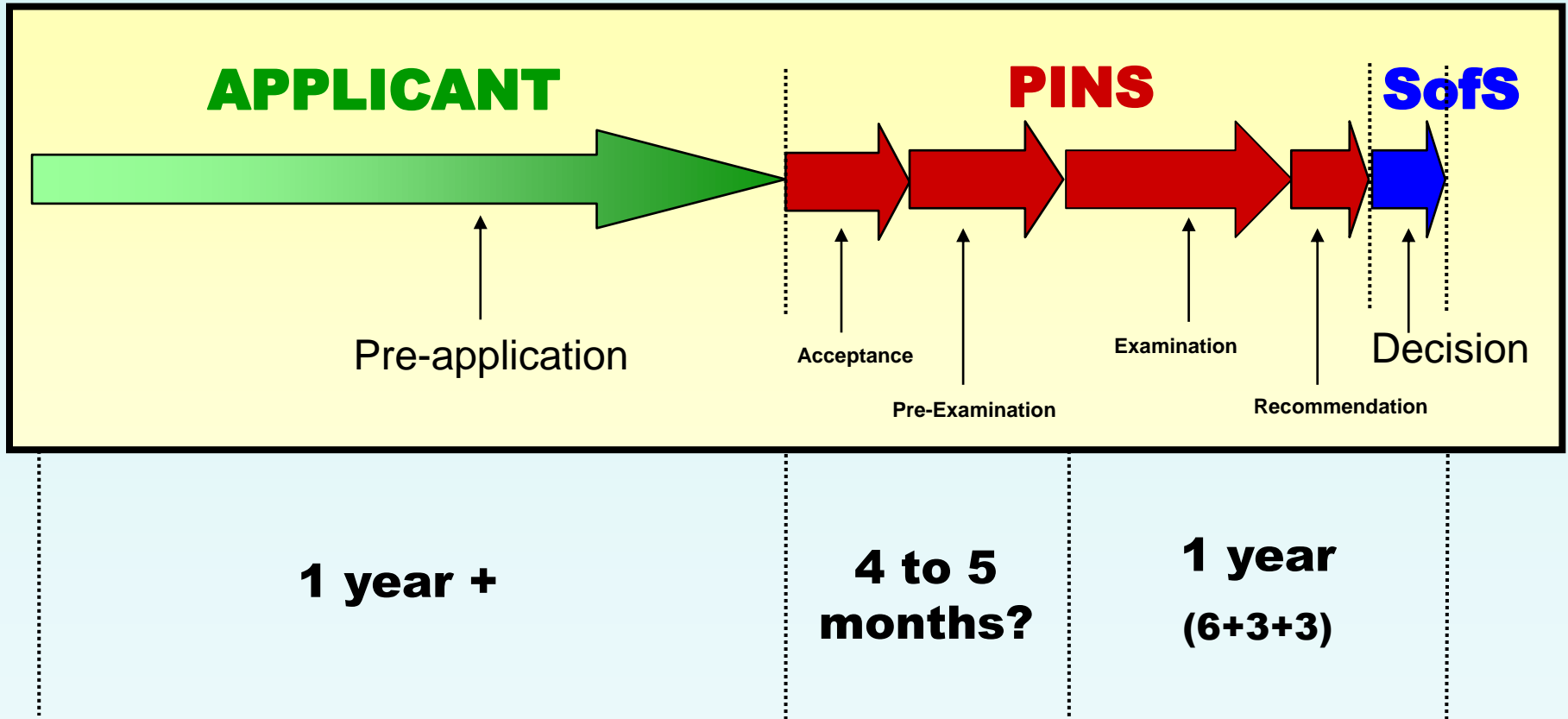

The PA2008 process





Pre-application: Applicant's role

~~UNPREPARED~~



- Design evolution (mitigation)
- Assemble order lands
- **Statutory consultation**
 - Prescribed consultees, LAs, PILs
 - Community consultation (SoCC)
 - 'have regard to' (s49)
- Total application: No shocks!



Pre-application: local authorities' role

~~UNPREPARED~~

- Statutory consultee
- 'Community Champions' (SoCC)
- Objective technical evidence (LIRs)
- Discharge of Requirements*
- Enforcement*

* early and on-going dialogue: No shocks, no surprises!



Acceptance stage

- 28 calendar days to decide
- Principal considerations:
 - Full suite of documents
 - NSIP
 - Ensure all plans are correct
 - Consultation Report
 - **Adequacy of Consultation**
 - Satisfactory standard





Pre-examination

- Application accepted
- **Relevant Representations**
- Examining Authority appointed
- Initial Assessment of Principal Issues
- Preliminary Meeting





Examination stage

- Six months
- Written process
- (Virtual) events
 - Compulsory acquisition hearings
 - Issue specific hearings
 - Open floor hearings
- Relevant and important



Recommendation stage

- ExA has three months to prepare and submit to SoS Recommendation Report taking account of:
 - National Policy Statement(s)
 - Local Impact Report(s)
 - Important and relevant matters
 - International obligations
- Recommended DCO included



Decision stage

- Relevant SoS has three months to take decision taking account of:
 - National Policy Statement(s)
 - Local Impact Report(s)
 - Important and relevant matters
 - International obligations
- Judicial review
