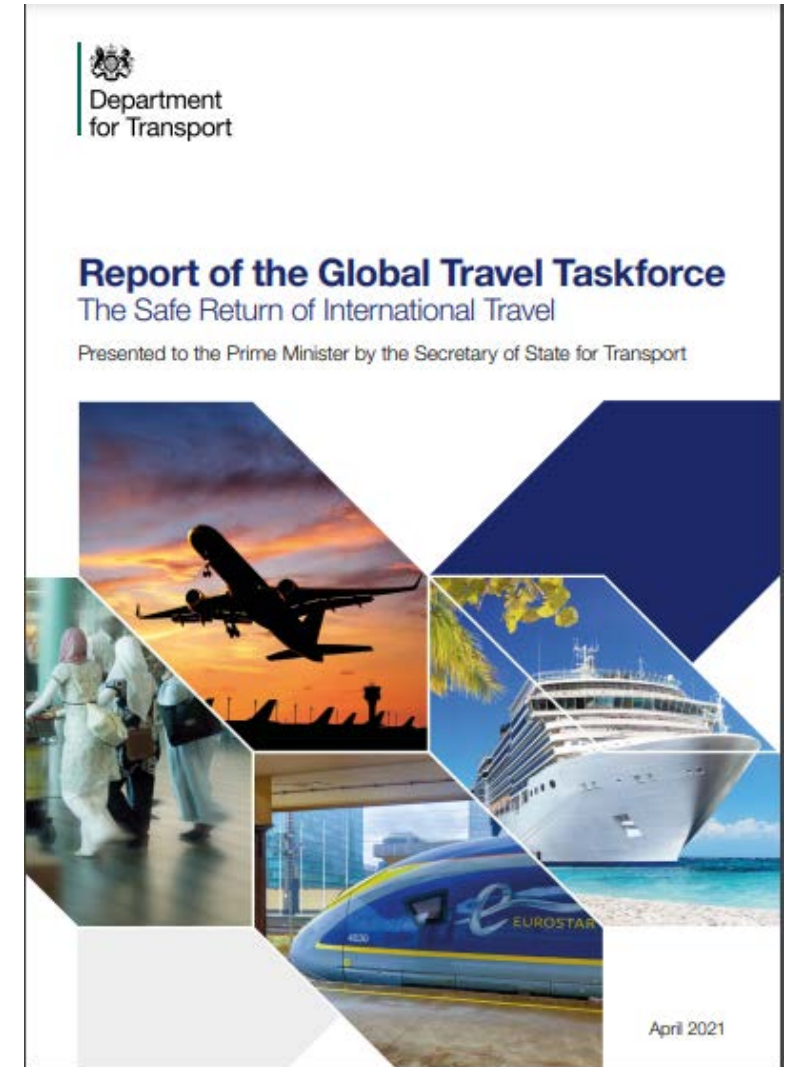


# Report of the Global Travel Taskforce

Published on 9<sup>th</sup> April 2021

Sets out the safe return of international travel with 14 recommendations centred around:

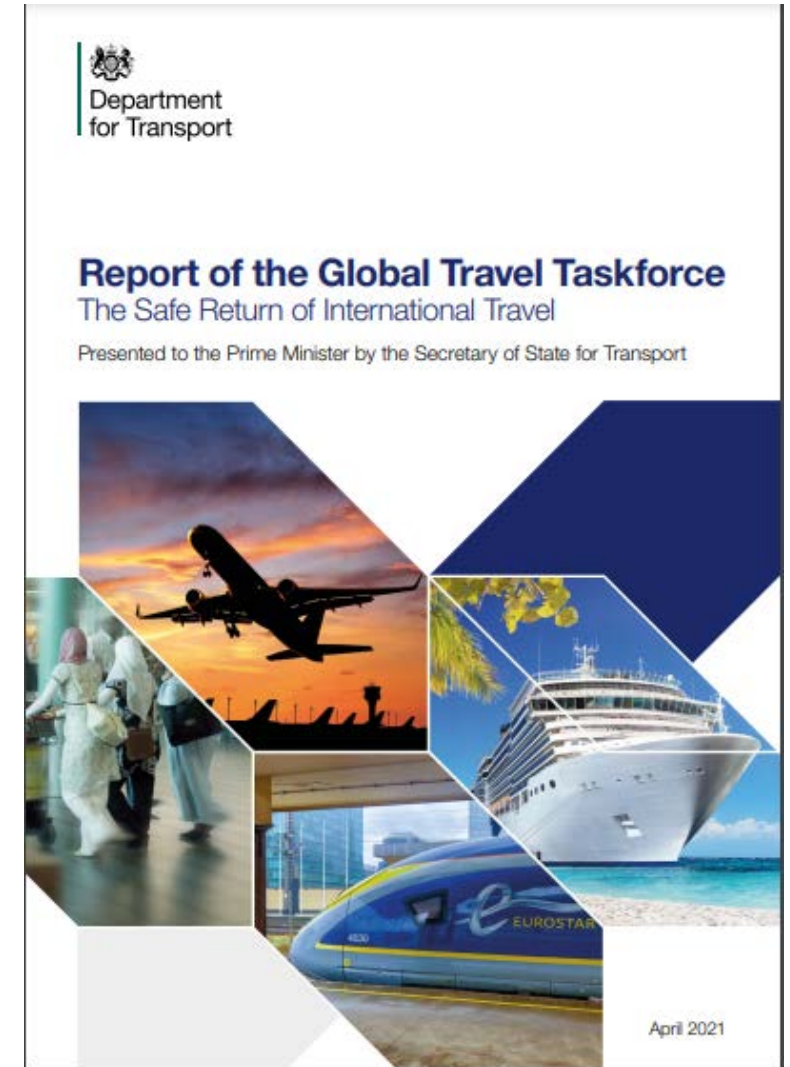
- A risk-based approach to opening international travel
- Readiness for international travel restart
- Consumer clarity and confidence
- Transition to future travel (inc travel certification and global standards)



# Report of the Global Travel Taskforce

## Key Recommendations (1)

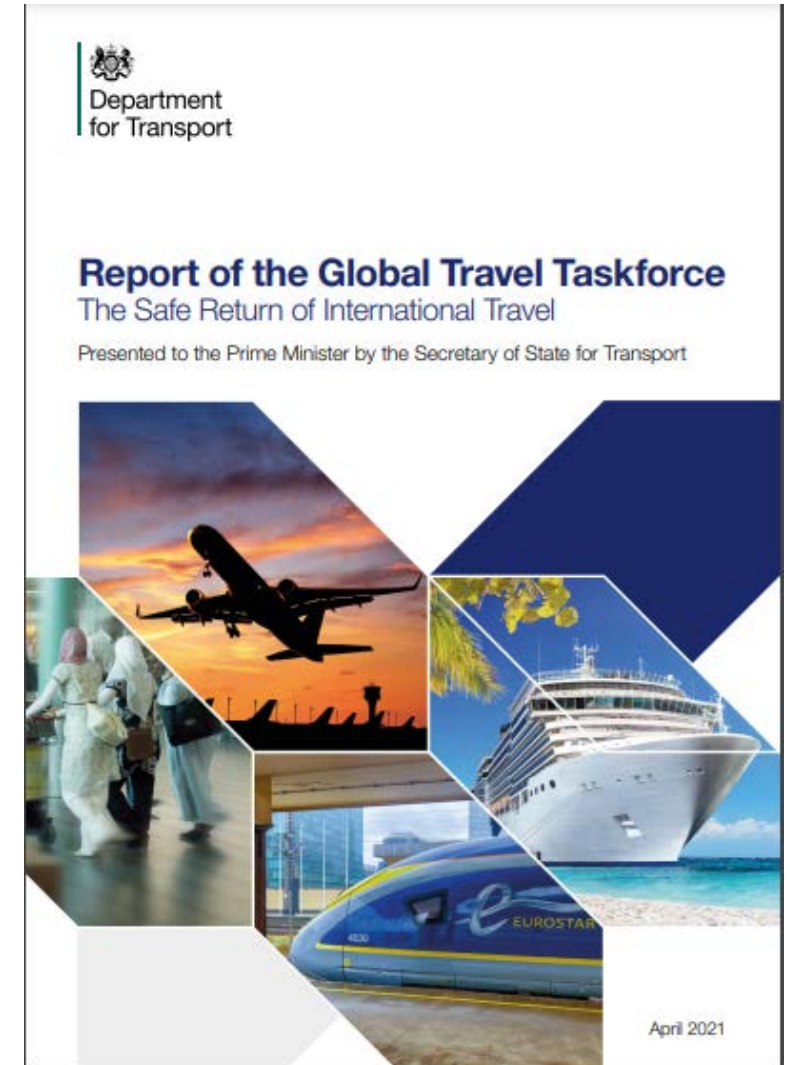
- Implement a 'traffic light' country system, to which different restrictions are applied depending on risk
- Introduce a 'Green Watch list' to support outbound travellers identify countries most at risk of moving from green to amber
- Hold 3 check points – 28 June, 31 July and 1 October to review
- Improve the Passenger Locator Form with full e-gates integration
- Establish a joint UK govt and industry working group to ensure border readiness
- Ensure measures in place to assess and assure safety readiness, including targeted interventions to ensure operational safety
- Improve guidance to provide more clarity on health and pax requirements
- Introduce a passengers COVID-19 charter by 17 May setting out consumer rights



# Report of the Global Travel Taskforce

## Key Recommendations (2)

- Maintain a leadership role with multilateral organisations including ICAO, IMO and OECD and work with partners such as G20 to develop strategies for reopening international travel
- Support the integration of a national digital certification system that is interoperable, safe and secure
- Explore bilateral pilots for testing initiatives such as digital solutions on particular routes.

# Report of the Global Travel Taskforce – Next Steps

## Government

Implement recommendations taking a science led approach while supporting the economy. Confirm in early May if non essential international travel can resume on 17<sup>th</sup> May 2021

## Gatwick

Working with Govt and cross industry our priorities are:

- Readiness for 17<sup>th</sup> May
- Early identification of countries in each category
- Digitisation of paperwork and ensuring sufficient resources for border checks
- Testing on arrival – lateral flow / cost of PCR
- Arrangements for those fully vaccinated / travel certification
